The roles, responsibilities, and expectations of the committee were shared by the committee chair and discussed and agreed upon by the members to serve accordingly from the *Educator Preparation Provider Unit Governance Handbook.*:

Initial Programs Assessment Committee

The Initial Programs Assessment Committee (IPAC) will serve as the oversight committee for the initial programs assessment activities of the EPP Unit. The CAEP Coordinator and the Professional Education Program Director will serve as Ex Officio members of the IPAC.

Committee responsibilities will include:

- 1. annually review and analyze unit assessment artifacts;
- 2. annually review the assessment system as it applies to initial programs.
- 3. annually review assessment procedures to ensure fairness, accuracy, consistency, and the avoidance of bias.
- 4. prepare an annual unit assessment report. The completed report will be sent to the Head of Unit no later than May 31 of each year. The report should include areas of strength and/or areas of improvement.

There was general discussion of Unit Assessment Plan. Members are encouraged to bring and ask questions.

 - a. Dispositions assessment:

Old Dominion was suggested to for the base assessment due to reliability and validity stats. At the next meeting Math and Social Science will share their current assessment instruments. The dispositions assessment will become a part of the Admission process. Prior to admission to the teacher education program, the candidate will complete the self-assessment and reflection of presumed needs. Live-Text will be a requirement for and upon admission to teacher education ASTATE Jonesboro campus. Discussion as to most effective way to link this to initial acceptance/implementation. PEP will need to include the new admission criteria and language. Need to meet soon to determine process "as technology progresses", begin procedure in Sp'18 and totally in effect for admission by F'18, by ELED, MLED, and SPED. Scott will look at the Intro to Secondary Syllabus for Admission point changes and all EPP changes in bulletin by Fall 2018.

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b. Technology Assessment:
